



# How to qualify for a license



- Be incorporated in the District of Columbia as a non-profit.
- Have twenty active members (ten if senior citizen's group).
- Be authorized by its Constitution, articles of incorporation or bylaws to further a lawful purpose in the District of Columbia.
- Operate without profit to its members.
- Have been in existence not less than one year preceding license application date.
- Be incorporated in Maryland or Virginia as a non-profit group, meet licensing requirements of respective jurisdiction and guarantee that 30% or more of net proceeds are contributed to eligible D.C. organizations or programs.

## How to apply for a license

- Get your license application from the Charitable Games Division of the D.C. Lottery by phone request or stop by in person and pick it up.
- Complete and return application along with:
  - · Check or money order for license fee.
  - Proof of ownership of prizes or surety bond for an amount 15% above the total value of all prizes.
  - Copy of IRS or D.C. Finance & Revenue Tax Exempt notice.
  - Certificate of Good Standing from D.C. Consumer & Regulatory Affairs.
  - · Sample of tickets to be printed.


The Board issues four (4) classes of Regular Bingo Licenses:

Class B — 251 - 499 players	\$250
Class C — 250 or fewer players	\$50
Class C — Senior Citizen Groups .	\$10
Class D — Senior Citizen Groups (Recreationial)	No charge

### **Limited Period Bingo License**

The Board issues three (3) classes of Limited Period Bingo Licenses:

Class	Fee
Class A — 500 or more players	\$200
Class B — 251 - 499 players	\$100
Class C — 250 or fewer players	\$25
Class C — Senior Citizen Groups	\$10



### **Raffle License**

The Board issues five (5) classes of Raffle Licenses:

Class	Fee
Class 1	
Class 2	.\$100
Class 3	\$50
Class 4	\$25
Class 5	\$10



# **License Fees**

Organizations already licensed to conduct a regular or limited period bingo, and applying for a multihall bingo license, must pay the additional multihall bingo license fee. Unlicensed organizations applying for a multihall bingo license must also obtain a regular or limited period bingo license, and will be charged a separate fee for each license.

### Regular Multihall Bingo License

The Board issues three (3) classes of Regular Multihall Bingo Licenses:

Class	Fee
Class A — 500 or more players	\$500
Class B — 251 - 499 players	\$250
Class C - 250 or fewer players	\$50

# **Suppliers**

A business, firm, corporation, partnership, or association which sells, rents, leases or distributes bingo, raffle and Monte Carlo equipment and supplies must have a license issued by the D.C. Lottery & Charitable Games Control Board.

Any person, firm, partnership or corporation authorized to do business in the District of Columbia may apply for a license to sell, lease or distribute Monte Carlo, bingo, raffle equipment and supplies.

### **Suppliers License Fees**

One class of license will be issued for the sale and rental of equipment, supplies and the provision of personnel.

License renewal fees are determined by gross revenue derived from the sale of equipment, supplies and game-related service.

The Board has developed rules, regulations and specific guidelines for the conduct of bingo games, raffles, and

To qualify for a license, an organization must be incorporated in the District of Columbia as a not for profit organization. Not for profit organizations incorporated in Maryland and Virginia may also apply for a license to conduct RAFFLES in the District of Columbia. All organizations must purchase, rent or lease all equipment and supplies from a licensed supplier.

The Charitable Games division of the D.C. Lottery has a mission to assure that charitable gaming is at all times fair and honest and that proceeds and prizes are handled according to established rules. The rules, regulations and guidelines are designed to maximize benefits for the public at large.

This brochure provides the general guidelines and fees for license applications. Once a license is approved, specific rules for the conduct of bingo games, raffles and Monte Carlo Night parties will be provided.
